

HEART FAILURE

Heart failure is a **progressive, debilitating** and **potentially fatal condition** that occurs when the heart cannot pump enough blood around the body¹



SYMPTOMS

include **shortness of breath, swollen ankles** or **swelling** and **fatigue**, amongst others²

LEADING CAUSES include:²



Coronary heart disease



High blood pressure



Diabetes

PREVALENCE

Approximately

26 million people



worldwide are living with heart failure^{3,4}

1 person in 5 is expected to develop heart failure⁵



Prevalence of **heart failure**



is expected to increase as the population ages²

ECONOMIC BURDEN

Heart failure is the leading cause of hospitalisation in the **US and Europe**³



>1 MILLION admissions per year as a primary diagnosis³

Treatment of heart failure accounts for approximately

1-2%

of healthcare expenditure in **Europe and the US**⁶

\$ Globally, heart failure was estimated to cost about **US\$ 100 BILLION** in 2012⁴

COMORBIDITIES

74% of people with heart failure have at least 1 comorbidity:⁷



41% chronic kidney disease



29% diabetes



29% anaemia

Associated comorbidities contribute to mortality and impaired quality of life⁷

MANAGEMENT



There is a high unmet need in the treatment of heart failure, as up to **45%** of people admitted to hospital with **heart failure die within 1 year** and half die within 5 years⁵

Currently, there is **no cure for heart failure**, but medicine and lifestyle changes can help reduce mortality, morbidity and improve quality of life.²

Further research is also underway into new ways to **treat heart failure and its complications**⁵
